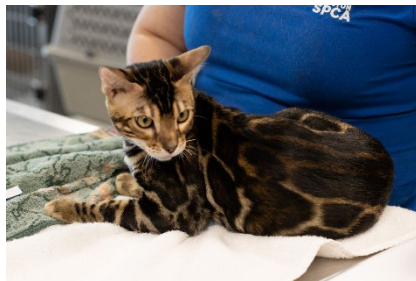

Nearly 70 Exotic Cats Rescued From Alvin Property Since March

Emaciated Asian Leopard Cats and Bengal Cats Now in Care of Houston SPCA

HOUSTON (September 22, 2023) – On Wednesday, 49 Bengal and Asian leopard cats, including a litter of four-week-old Bengal kittens, one dog and two domestic cats were surrendered to the Houston SPCA at a deplorable Alvin property near the 1900 block of CR 235 after the owner of the cats recently passed away. All the animals are now receiving individualized care on their campus.



Back in March at the same property in Alvin, Houston SPCA Animal Cruelty Investigators and veterinarians rescued 19 exotic cats, including one litter of Bengal kittens after they were discovered in deplorable living conditions. They were treated for gastrointestinal and respiratory diseases at the Houston SPCA. The Asian leopard cats were subsequently placed in sanctuaries while the Bengals were placed into new homes.

In Harris County, the Houston SPCA's 11-member animal cruelty investigations team partners with Harris County Pct. 1 Constable's Office and other law enforcement agencies to combat animal cruelty. They also work with law enforcement agencies across 9 surrounding counties, rescuing victims of animal cruelty across the region.
