More Than 100 Baby Egrets and Doves Injured by Beryl's Wrath Take Flight of a Lifetime

Among the 1,600 Birds Rescued or Brought into Center After Hurricane Beryl

HOUSTON (July 14, 2024) — More than 100 baby and juvenile egrets and doves took an extraordinary flight this afternoon with helping hands and big hearts from Pilots N Paws. These birds were among the 1,600 injured and orphaned wild animals brought into their care after Hurricane Beryl hit last week.



The Houston SPCA Wildlife Center stabilized the birds while in their care and were ready today to be placed aboard and secured for a flight to Wild West Wildlife Rehabilitation in Amarillo, Texas where they will finish their rehabilitation journey.
