Hundreds of Egrets Injured or Drowned After Hurricane Beryl Hit the Texas Coast

*Houston SPCA's Wildlife Center of Texas Rescues Approximately 300 Juveniles
and Baby Egrets in Northeast Houston Neighborhood*

HOUSTON (July 8, 2024) – Hundreds of egrets nesting in trees located in a northeast Houston neighborhood off Kiowa River Lane were seriously impacted by Hurricane Beryl after many juveniles and baby egrets were blown out of their nests and drowned, while hundreds more were found waterlogged and shivering in the grass below.



Houston SPCA's Wildlife Center responded to the scene this afternoon where they were able to rescue approximately 300 of the ill and orphaned egrets among the hundreds who were found deceased.

They are currently being triaged at the Houston SPCA's Wildlife Center where they will receive individualized treatment from staff veterinarians. Summer is baby season for egrets, and it is common to find so many in nesting areas in and around Houston.
