27 Dogs Rescued from Deplorable Conditions in Southwest Houston

HOUSTON (July 10, 2025) — Twenty-seven dogs were rescued yesterday afternoon from hoarding and cruel confinement at a southwest Houston home near the 11,000 block of Caesar and Ashling. The rescue was made possible through the collaborative efforts of the Houston SPCA and Harris County Constable Precinct 1.

Many of the dogs were found emaciated or underweight, covered in fleas and living in filthy wire kennels while some were roaming the

property filled with scattered debris contaminated with urine and feces, creating an unsafe and inhumane environment.

All the rescued animals were transported to the Houston SPCA where they received individualized veterinary examinations and began a nutritional refeeding program.

“We rely heavily on our community to report animal cruelty,” said Dr. Roberta Westbrook, Chief Veterinarian at the Houston SPCA. “These reports are critical, and they save lives.”
