Houston SPCA, Harris County Constable Precinct 1 Rescued 50 Dogs in Southeast Houston

HOUSTON (July 22, 2025) Houston SPCA's Animal Cruelty Investigators and law enforcement partners Harris County Constable Precinct 1 rescued 50 puppies and dogs from a southeast Houston property where they were found living in horrific conditions.

Officials at the scene said the floors were covered in urine with piles of feces scattered throughout the home. The dogs and puppies were suffering from various forms of neglect including untreated skin conditions, urine-soaked and matted fur as well as dental disease and other health concerns.

"These animals were living in a diseased environment that was not only unhealthy but dangerous to any living being," said Dr. Roberta Westbrook, Chief Veterinarian for the Houston SPCA. "The high levels of ammonia made this a very toxic space," said Westbrook.

All the dogs were immediately removed from the home and transported to the Houston SPCA's campus, where veterinary and animal care teams provided medical evaluations and a plans for their individualized treatment.

A hearing is scheduled next week and the investigation is ongoing.
